Planting Daffodils

- 1. Select high-quality daffodil bulbs that have not dried out. ...
- 2. Plant bulbs in the fall—about 2 to 4 weeks before the ground freezes.
- 3. Plant bulbs 1-1/2 to 5 times their own depth. ...
- 4. Daffodils will tolerate some crowding but prefer to be spaced 3 to 6 inches apart.

Planting Squill

- 1. Dig holes and plant the bulbs 3-4" deep and 4" apart. The bulbs are rounded, with small points on the tops; these points should be placed facing up.
- 2. After planting, water well to settle the soil around the bulbs. Roots will form in the autumn.
- 3. When in bloom feel free to cut flowers for colorful bouquets. This will not hurt the plants.
- 4. After blooming has finished for the season leave the foliage in place; don't cut it off. The leaves will gather sunlight and provide nourishment for next year's show. Water as needed during active growth periods; about 1" of moisture per week is a good estimate.
- 5. By early to mid-summer the leaves will yellow and die back as the plant slips into dormancy.
