WHEREAS, the Township has been advised by the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs that it must publicly bid a contract to operate and maintain the wastewater treatment system during the period from January 1, 2020 to the date of closing on the sale of the system to New Jersey American Water; and

WHEREAS, the Township is seeking bids for the operation of its Wastewater Treatment System during that interim period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The proposal submitted by Veolia Water-North America Operating Services, LLC on May 30, 2019 to operate and maintain the Township's Wastewater Treatment System for a term of five years, with three five-year renewal options, is hereby rejected.

WHEREAS, Township Administrator Nancy Malool conducted a search and has recommended that Maryann Amiano, who is a Certified Tax Collector, be appointed Long Hill Township Tax Collector in accordance with the terms and conditions of her offer letter dated November 26, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee agrees with the Administrator's recommendation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. Maryann Amiano is hereby appointed Long Hill Township Tax Collector for a four-year term commencing January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2023.
 - 2. Her annual salary shall be \$62,500.
 - 3. Her standard work week shall be 37.5 hours.
 - 4. She shall not be entitled to overtime or compensatory time.
- 5. All other terms and conditions of employment are set forth in her November 26, 2019 offer letter, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the Township Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual.

RESOLUTION #19-337 AUTHORIZING A SEWER CONNECTION FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 76 OVERLOOK ROAD (BLOCK 12502 LOT 1.02)

WHEREAS, the Township is currently subject to a voluntary sewer ban; and

WHEREAS, Jonathan and Kimberley DeCristofaro, the owners of property located at 76 Overlook Road (Block 12502, Lot 25) have requested authorization to connect to the Township's sanitary sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the Township has adopted by reference the NJDEP sewer ban exemption criteria set forth in N.J.A.C. 7:14A-22.22; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 7:14A-22.22 provides in relevant part that:

"A sewer ban exemption may be granted for projects . . . if the proposed project will have a total projected flow of 600 gallons per day or less . . . [and] will be constructed and/or operated on a tax lot which is the result of a one-time sub division of a single lot into two lots, subsequent to the date of the ban. In this instance, a total of 600 gallons per day may be approved for the combination of both lot; . . . and the proposed project does not require a sewer extension "; and

WHEREAS, the property located at 76 Overlook Road (Block 12502, Lot 1.02) meets those exemption criteria; and

WHEREAS, Sections 22-3.1 and 22-3.3 of the Township Code require a connection fee of \$10,120; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Jonathan and Kimberley DeCristofaro c/o 76 Overlook Road, block 102501 lot 1 was built in 1948; the property was subdivided March 5, 2019 creating block 12502 lot 1.02; and

WHEREAS, the Township is in the process of selling its wastewater plant to NJ American Water Company; and

WHEREAS, NJ American Water Company has agreed to allow connections subsequent to the closing for those properties for which the connection fee has been paid to the Township in full prior to the date of closing of sale. Connection fees are not refundable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. Jonathan and Kimberley DeCristofaro c/o 76 Overlook Road, are hereby granted permission to connect the property located at 76 Overlook Road (Block 12502, Lot 1.02) to the Township wastewater treatment system upon payment of the \$10,120 connection fee in accordance with Section 22-3.2 of the Township Code entitled "Exemptions."
- 2. This permission will expire upon the closing of the sale of the wastewater treatment system to New jersey American Water unless all connection fees have been paid to the Township in full prior to that date.

WHEREAS, the Township has a need to acquire these services via a non-fair and open contract pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A - 20.4 or 20.5 as appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Township Chief Financial Officer has determined and certified in writing that the value of the acquisition will exceed \$17,000; and

WHEREAS, contracts for professional services may be awarded without public bidding pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-5(1)(a)(I); and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified in writing to the Township Committee the availability of adequate funds to pay the maximum amount of this contract; and

WHEREAS, the contractor has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that the business entity has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Township of Long Hill in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit the contractor named herein from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract, as well as a Township pay-to-play certification.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Long Hill, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:
