Comm. Roshto requested approval from the Township Committee to commence this new program in 2014. **Voice Vote**: All in favor. Mr. Henry was instructed to proceed with finalizing the work necessary for the program to begin in 2014

ORDINANCES:

ORDINANCE PUBLIC HEARING/CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION

BOND ORDINANCE 322-13 PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENT OF THE SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG HILL, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$4,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,500,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG HILL, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS**:

The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of Long Hill, in the County of Morris, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$4,500,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefore.

For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the said \$4,500,000 appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$4,500,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$4,500,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement of the sanitary sewerage system in and by the Township, including the reduction of infiltration and inflow and the improvement of the wastewater treatment plant by the installation of influent screening and an ultra-violet disinfection system, together with all structures, site work, equipment, work and materials necessary therefore or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefore on file or to be filed in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$4,500,000.

(c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$4,500,000.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated: The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.

The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$4,500,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

An aggregate amount not exceeding \$900,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

This bond ordinance authorized obligations of the Township solely for purposes described in paragraph (d) of section 40A:2-7 of said Local Bond Law; and said purposes are in the public interest and are for the health, welfare, convenience or betterment of the inhabitants of the Township and the amounts to be expended for said purposes pursuant to this bond ordinance are not unreasonable or exorbitant and the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will not materially impair the credit of the Township or substantially reduce its ability to pay punctually the principal of and interest on its debts and supply other essential public improvements and services, and the Local Finance Board in the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey has

heretofore made a determination to this effect and caused its consent to be endorsed upon a certified copy of this bond ordinance as passed upon first reading.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

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There was a short discussion and the Committee agreed to continue to add the Wastewater Improvements as a capital budget line item in their 6 year Plan in order for future Township Committees to continue to maintain the Wastewater System

Mayor Piserchia opened the meeting to public comment on Ordinance 322-13, seeing as there was no comment from the public, Mayor Piserchia closed public comment and called for a motion to approve the Bond Ordinance

MOVED by: Comm. Schuler, that Ordinance 322-13 be finally adopted on second reading **SECONDED** by: Comm. Roshto **ROLL CALL VOTE:** All in favor

DISCUSSION / ACTION ITEMS:

TURF FIELD Discussion

Public Comment for this item only: Please note: to help facilitate an orderly meeting and to permit the opportunity for anyone who wishes to be heard, speakers are asked to limit their comments to 3 minutes.

Mayor Piserchia noted that this portion of the agenda is for the public and Township Committee members to voice their opinion on two questions:

- 1) Should we turf Field #1 at Matthew G. Kantor Park?
- 2) If so, how should we fund the turf project?

Mayor Piserchia read aloud the referendum question that was approved at the November 4, 1997 election with regard to Municipal Open Space Recreation and Farmland and Historic Trust Fund

The Mayor introduced Joe Kozinski of Ferriero Engineering Firm – to discuss with the Committee and the public his turf cost study analysis that his firm prepared, at the request of the Township Committee for the 3 properties in question: 1- Kurz property, 2- Railroad Ave 3-Mathew G. Kantor Park

Also, invited guest from Applied Landscape Technology (turf contractor) – President Paul Martino, Philip Piro, Vice President.

The Township Committee allowed Engineer Kozinski to answer several questions from the with regards to the report.

The Mayor then opened the podium to the public:

- Greg Risotti Stirling, supports turfing Field #1 at MGK
- Courtney Ballard supports turfing Field #1 at MGK
- Bob Larkis support turfing field #1 and developing the Kurz property for a grass field as soon as possible.
- Jerry Aroneo stated that as far back as 2007 the public has been demanding more recreational space. Mr. Aroneo supports turf to satisfy the demands of the residents, however, Mr. Aroneo is not in favor of using open space trust fund money for anything other than land acquisition.
- Dr. Kasselbirdy, LHT resident and Lacrosse Coach in LHT supports turf Dr. Kasselbirdy advised the Committee that the LHT Lacrosse had to merge with Warren as there were not enough fields in LHT to support the league. Three quarters of the fields their league plays are turf and in his opinion is a very big advantage for their players. He recommended selling the Laura Drive property to help fund the turf project.

Mr. Piro of ALT was asked to estimate the cost of a regulated size turf field = \$1.2 million with lights for a property that had already been graded.

Joe Kozinski noted that either property, Kurz or MGK Field 1 could take 1.5 to 2.5 years to complete, depending on the drainage.

 Anthony Tomaro, Gillette resident, Coach in LHT and Warren – supports turfing Field 1 at MGK

Paul Martino ALT, 10 out of 10 turf fields that they have installed have lights = estimate of \$250,000. New technology lights do not shine into the surrounding residential homes,

- Rob Cunningham, Meyersville supports turfing Field 1 at MGK
- Paul Scanlon, 40 year resident and Soccer Coach supports turfing Field 1 at MGK. Member of the Board of Directors of Watchung Hills Soccer. Their Soccer League will certainly be amenable to donating money for some of the expenses. The current grass filed at MGK cannot be properly maintained due to continued use.
- Lisa Scanlon, LHT Recreation Director
- Karen Millette 19 year resident, does not support turfing

- Chris Ruby, Millington, concerned about the traffic impact for the Kurz property supports turfing Field 1 at MGK
- Dennis Sandow 80 % of tax payers of Long Hill Township will not use a turf field! Are we certain that artificially turf immune form fungus growth? Have we fully considered the cost of scrubbing contaminates out of the field each year?
- Paul Scanlon reiterated that maintenance is \$2,500.00
- Steve Scrobocks, Meyersville does not support turf. 50% of the town is currently open space, and would like the township to reconsider reducing the tax to fund the open space trust.

Comm. Meringolo made a motion, seconded by Comm. Roshto to allow the extension of the Township Committee meeting beyond 11:00 PM. Voice Vote: all in favor

As there were no further comments from the public, Public session for this item was closed. The Mayor asked the Committee to approve soliciting a bid for turfing Field 1 at MGK Park Extensive discussion ensued between the Committee members, the CFO and the Engineer. Atty. Pidgeon recommended not going out to bid at this point, The Committee agreed to get better estimates on the cost of the MGK turfing vs. the Kurz property building a new recreation park. Mr. Henry was instructed to find out if an egress point onto Valley Road is possible. After a straw poll, the majority of the Committee members were not ready to commit to spending any funds on this project at this point until sufficient information can be gathered, i.e., more accurate estimates, the out come of the Kurz eminent domain hearing, etc.

COMMITTEE LIAISON REPORTS:

Comm. Meringolo reported that the School Board is currently going thru their budget cycle and will remain under the 2% cap. There will be a school board referendum question present to the public in March regarding a bond for roof replacement.

Comm. Schuler reported that the Recreation Element of the Master Plan had been completed by the RAC and was being sent to the Planning Board
